FORMING DISTRICT.)

This being the time heretofore set for

further hearing in the matter of the

proposed formation of Artesia Cemetery District, said matter is called up; two communications, signed respectively, by E. W. Bringhurst and H. L. Gordon, dated September 22nd, 1928, requesting that their names be withdrawn from protests heretofore filed against the formation of said proposed district, are presented; G. B. Gamble, Nora Leeper, and Millie B. Thompson are sworn and examined; and on motion of Supervisor Beaty, duly seconded and carried, it is ordered that the following resolution be, and the same is hereby adopted, to-wit:

WHEREAS, a petition signed by Mrs. Margaret E. Purviance, et al, was presented to the Board of Supervisors of the County of Los Angeles, at a regular meeting of said Board held on the 13th day of August, 1928, requesting the formation of a public cemetery district to be known as Artesia Cemetery District, pursuant to a certain act of the Legislature of the State of California, entitled "An act to provide for the organization and improvement of public cemetery districts", approved June 1, 1921, as amended; and,

WHEREAS, the Board of Supervisors thereafter fixed Monday, the 17th day of September, 1928, at the hour of 10:00 o'clock A. M., as the time, and the chambers of the Board of Supervisors of the County of Los Angeles in the Hall of Records, City of Los Angeles, as the place for the hearing of said petition; and,

WHEREAS, notice of the time and place of the hearing of said petition has been given by the Clerk of said Board of Supervisors

by publication once a week for two successive weeks, namely on August 24th and August 31st, 1928 in the "Artesia News", a newspaper of general circulation, printed and published in the said proposed district and in said County, which notice as published contained a copy of said petition and stated that any person, residing in or on any property within said proposed district, might appear before the Board of Supervisors at the hearing on said petition and show cause why said petition should not be granted, or the proposed boundaries of said district changed; and,

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WHEREAS, a full, fair and impartial hearing was accorded to all persons interested, and evidence has been taken on all the matters upon which evidence is necessary, including the allegations of the petition, the sufficiency and genuineness thereof, the sufficiency and genuineness of the signatures attached thereto and the sufficiency of the publication of said petition and notice,

NOW, THEREFORE, BE IT RESOLVED:

That the Board of Supervisors of the County of Los Angeles does hereby find and determine as follows:

1. That said petition is signed by not less than fifty citizens who are owners of land located within the proposed cemetery district and whose names appear as such owners of land upon the last completed assessment roll of the County of Los Angeles, within which county all of the acreage of said proposed district is situated.
2. That the signatures attached to said petition are genuine.
3. That said petition definitely describes the boundaries of the proposed cemetery district and is sufficient in all particulars.
4. That the notice of hearing of said petition and the publication thereof are sufficient and that the petitioners have complied fully with the requirements of said act.
5. That public interest and necessity require and it is the order of this Board of Supervisors that a public cemetery district to be known as Artesia Cemetery District be and the same is hereby created and established, and that the boundaries of said

district are hereby defined and established as follows:

Beginning at the intersection of the northerly prolongation of the easterly line of Lot 273, Somerset Acres, Sheet 5, as shown on map recorded in Book 14, page 78 of Maps, records of Los Angeles County, with the center line of Center Street, as shown on map recorded in Book 3602, page 92, of Deeds, records of said county; thence easterly along said center line to the center line of New River and Artesia Road, as shown on said last mentioned map; thence easterly in a direct line to the intersection of the center lines of Main Street and Center Street, as shown on map of Petroleum Center, recorded in Book 1, pages 1 & 2 of Official Maps, records of said county; thence easterly in a direct line to the intersection of the center lines of Dohn Road and Center Street, all as delineated on map of Tract No. 7866 recorded in Book 112, pages 66 & 67 of Maps, records of said county; thence easterly in a direct line to the intersection of the center lines of Norwalk and Artesia Road and Center Street, all as delineated on said last mentioned map; thence easterly in a direct line to the intersection of the center lines of Center Street (formerly known as Artesia Avenue) and Carmenita Road (formerly known as Westminster Avenue) all as shown on map of Carmenita Acres Tract No. 1, recorded in Book 11, pages 194 and 195 of Maps, records of said county; thence southerly in a direct line to the southeast corner of Section 32, T 3 S, R 11 W, of the Rancho Los Coyotes as shown on map of Tract No. 5805, recorded in Book 60, page 38 of Maps, records of said county, said last mentioned corner being an angle point in the boundary of the County of Los Angeles as the same existed on July 7, 1928; thence southerly along said last mentioned boundary and following the same in all its various courses to the northerly boundary of the City of Long Beach (Annexation of January 10, 1910); thence westerly along the boundary of the City of Long Beach, as the same existed on July 23, 1925, and following the same in all its various courses to the center line of Palo Verde Avenue,

as described in deed to the County of Los Angeles, recorded in Book 6014, page 342 of Deeds, records of said county; thence northerly along said last mentioned center line to the center line of the Pacific Electric Railway right of way (formerly Los Angeles Inter Urban R. W.) as shown on map of Tract No. 2079, recorded in Book 22, page 182 of Maps, records of said county; thence northerly in a direct line to the southeasterly corner of Lot 292, aforesaid Somerset Acres, Sheet 5; thence northerly in a direct line to the point of beginning.

6. That G. B. Gamble, Edward Ashley, and W. J. Scheifele be, and they are hereby appointed as trustees to govern and manage said district, and that said trustees shall hold office for a period of four years from and after the 24th day of September, 1928, and until the appointment and qualification of their successors.

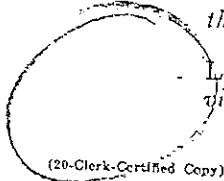
